IRELAND, Johnny Lee (1949- ). Sergeant, 36/2<sup>nd</sup> CCT Squad, U.S. Air Force, 1970-1974.

IREY, George Washington (1841-1932). Private, Company G, Eighth Ohio Infantry, Union Army, Civil War. Buried in the Bethany Center Cemetery.

IREY, Isaac Glenn (1893-1965). Colorado, A. S., U.S. Navy, World War I. Buried in the Bethany Center Cemetery.

IREY, Isaac John (1814-1906). Private, Company E, 34<sup>th</sup> Ohio Volunteer Infantry, Union Army, Civil War. Buried in the Bethany Center Cemetery.

IREY, John M. Company G, 139<sup>th</sup> Infantry, 35<sup>th</sup> Division, U.S. Army, World War I.

ISAACSON, Elmer E. Private, Battery F, 69<sup>th</sup> Field Artillery, U.S. Army, World War I.

Ise, Henry Christopher (1841-1900). Private, Company H, 10<sup>th</sup> Illinois Volunteer Infantry, Union Army, Civil War. Buried in the Downs Cemetery. Henry's surname was originally *Eisenmanger*; at his enlistment a captain changed it to *Ise* because the officer could spell that. Henry kept the new surname after the war in order to avoid any future confusion with his papers.

Isenberger, Nathan Perry (1896-1956). Veteran, World War I. Buried in the Natoma Cemetery.

Ives, Edward L. (1838-1901). Private, Company B, Third Minnesota Infantry, Union Army, Civil War. Buried in the Sumner Cemetery.

IVES, Gerald Franklin. Veteran, World War II.

IVIE, Dallas R. Private First Class, 10<sup>th</sup> Mountain Division, Fifth Army, U.S. Army, World War II. Wounded in battle.

JACK, Robert S. (1845-1891). Veteran, Civil War. Buried in the Mount Herman Cemetery.

Jackson, Andrew (1841-1919). Private, Company C, Eighth Indiana Cavalry, Union Army, Civil War. Buried in the Downs Cemetery.

JACKSON, Donald A. Sergeant, United States Army Air Force Reserves; World War II.

JACKSON, John (*Unknown*-1944). Lieutenant, Company G, 66<sup>th</sup> Armored Regiment, U.S. Army, World War II. **Killed in action** in Belgium. Recipient of the Silver Star and the Purple Heart.

Jacobe, Albert Lewis (1920-1981). Corporal, Second Class Gunner, TS Machine Gun, U. S. Army, World War II. Buried in the Downs Cemetery.

JACOB, Arlington N. (1919- ). Staff Sergeant, 358<sup>th</sup> Replacement Company, 70<sup>th</sup> Replacement Battalion, Field Artillery, U.S. Army, World War II. Headquarters Company, 5016<sup>th</sup> ASU Sta. Comp., Korean War. Bronze Service Star recipient.

JACOBE, Eugene Gordon "Jack" (1921-1967). Machinist's Mate First Class, U.S. Coast Guard, World War II.

JACOBE, Floyd Edward Jr. (1923- ). Private First Class, Anti-Aircraft Company, 739<sup>th</sup> Anti-Aircraft Gun Battalion, U.S. Army, World War II. Bronze Service Star recipient.

Jacobe, Karl (1910-1981). Fireman Third Class, U.S. Navy, World War II. Buried in the Sumner Cemetery.

Jacobe, Lewis Franklin (1895-1956). Kansas, Private First Class, Headquarters Company, 30<sup>th</sup> Field Artillery, World War I. Buried in the Osborne Cemetery.

JACOBE, Melvin Elwood (1918- ). Staff Sergeant, Weapons Troop, Eighth Cavalry, U.S. Army, World War II.

JACOBE, Raymond Vernon. Veteran, World War II.

JOHNSON, David Gray (1927- ). Fighter Pilot, U.S. Navy, 1945-1948.

Johnson, Edward William (1931–1968). Private First Class, 363<sup>rd</sup> Ordnance Ammunition Company, Korean War. Buried in the Downs Cemetery.

JOHNSON, Ernest. Veteran, World War II.

johnson, Floyd William (1893–1985). Captain, Washburn Ambulance Company, U.S. Army, World War I. Major, U.S. Army Air Corps, World War II. Buried in the Downs Cemetery.
