KARNS, Keith T. First Sergeant, 622<sup>nd</sup> Engineer Base Equipment Company, U.S. Army, World War II. Recipient of two Bronze Stars.

KASER, Raymond F. Corporal, 58<sup>th</sup> Aircraft Engineering Squad, 558<sup>th</sup> Army Air Force Base Unit, U.S. Army Air Corps, World War II.

KASER, Wayne Albertus (1918-1972). U.S. Army, World War II. Recipient of the Bronze Star and the Purple Heart.

KASTER, Forrest W. (1915-1944). Private First Class, Company C, 46<sup>th</sup> Armored Infantry Battalion, Fifth Armored Division, World War II. **Killed in action** in the Hurtgen Forest, Germany. Buried in the Natoma Cemetery.

KAUFFMAN, Ruben (1839-1910). Private, Company D, 117<sup>th</sup> Pennsylvania Infantry, Union Army, Civil War. Buried in the Osborne Cemetery.

KEE, James. Veteran, World War II.

KEEVER, Emanuel. Company A, 118<sup>th</sup> Pennsylvania Infantry, Union Army, Civil War.

KEIRNS, Bert. Student Army Training Corps, U.S. Army, World War I.

KEIRNS, John Nixon (1827-1913). Private, Company E, 40<sup>th</sup> Ohio Infantry, also Sergeant, Company E, 51<sup>st</sup> Ohio Infantry; Union Army, Civil War. Buried in the Osborne Cemetery.

KELLER, Cecil Wesley. (1922-1945). Seaman Second Class, U. S. Naval Reserves. **Killed in action** in South Pacific Theater, World War II. Buried in the Grand Center Cemetery.

KELLER, Glenn E. (1888-1959). Kansas, Private, U.S. Army, World War I. Buried in the Grand Center Cemetery.

KELLEY, Benjamin Franklin (1835-*Unknown*). Corporal, Company G, 13<sup>th</sup> Kansas Volunteer Infantry, Union Army, Civil War.

KELLS, William A. (1922- ). Private First Class, 4136<sup>th</sup> Squadron, U.S. Army Air Corps, World War II.

KELLY, Eugene. U.S. Navy, World War II.

KELLY, William T. (1842-1879). Veteran, Civil War. Buried in the Corinth Cemetery.

Kendig, William J. (1845-1873). Private, Company 2, Pennsylvania Reserve Volunteer Infantry, Union Army, Civil War. Buried in the Osborne Cemetery.

KENNEDY, Peter (1931- ). Corporal, Battery D, 135<sup>th</sup> Anti-Aircraft Artillery Battalion, 1953-1955.

KENT, Harold Maret. Veteran, World War II.

KING, Karl A. Staff Sergeant, U.S. Army, World War II. U.S. Air Force, 1946-1967; Korean War. Recipient of Bronze Service Star and 4 Oak Leaf Clusters.

KING, Leo Leroy. Private First Class, 31<sup>st</sup> Infantry, U. S. Army, World War II. Corporal, U.S. Army, 1946-1949. Survivor of Bataan Death March. **Prisoner of war** in the Philippines and Fukuoka Prison Camp, Island of Honshu, Japan, 1942-1945. Recipient of the Purple Heart and 2 Bronze Stars.

KING, Melvin M. (1936-1999). Private Second Class, U.S. Army, 1957-1963.

KING, Richard Duane (1931- ). Corporal, M Company, Third Battalion, 28<sup>th</sup> Infantry Division, U.S. Army, Korean War. Recipient of Bronze Service Star.

KING, Thomas John (1895-1963). Brigade Headquarters Detachment, 164<sup>th</sup> Field Artillery, 89<sup>th</sup> Division, U.S. Army, World War I. Buried in the Fairview Cemetery.

KINSLEY, Noah. Company I, First Indiana Heavy Artillery, Union Army, Civil War.

KIPER, Ralph. 10<sup>th</sup> SA, 26<sup>th</sup> Division, U.S. Army, World War I.
