LARSEN, Walter (1894-1985). U.S. Navy, World War I. Buried in the Downs Cemetery.

Recipient of the Legion of Merit with Gold Star and the Purple Heart. The first U.S. medical doctor sent to the Korean War zone.

LESSENDEN, Dr. Glenn A. (1924-1989). Private, U.S. Army Air Corps, World War II. Captain, Strategic Air Command, U.S. Air Force, Korean War.

LESTER, Alanson Alfonzo (1824-1890). Private, Company I, 20th Wisconsin Infantry, Union Army, Civil War. Buried in the Osborne Cemetery.

LEWIS, Chester Lyle (1908-1994). 6638th Engineer Mine Clearance Company, U.S. Army, World War II. Buried in the Osborne Cemetery.

LEWIS, F. H. (*Unknown*-1885). Company D, 203rd Pennsylvania Infantry, Union Army, Civil War. Buried in the Grand Center Cemetery.

LEWIS, Guy E. (1895-1947). Kansas, Private, U.S. Army, World War I. Buried in the Natoma Cemetery.

LINGREEN, Stanley Carl (1926-1995). U.S. Navy, World War II. Buried in the Fairview Cemetery.

LINE, Alpheus (1819-1903). Corporal, Company E, 110th Ohio Infantry, Union Army, Civil War. Buried in the Bristow Cemetery.

LINN, Nelson. Company K, 44th Wisconsin Infantry, Union Army, Civil War.

LINVILLE, Lorenzo Arthur (1832-1904). Sergeant Major, Company D, 13th Iowa Infantry, also Captain, Company A, 47th Colored Infantry, Union Army, Civil War. Buried in the Osborne Cemetery.

LINVILLE, R. C. Sergeant, Company F., Second U.S. Cavalry.

LIPTON, Edwin F. (1841-1914). Company B, Pennsylvania Infantry, Union Army, Civil War. Buried in the Osborne Cemetery.

LIPTON, James Hoover (1827-1912). Master Sergeant, 45th Pennsylvania Volunteer Infantry, Union Army, Civil War.

LOCHARD, Michael F. (1840-1919). Corporal, Company H, Third Ohio Volunteer Infantry, Union Army, Civil War. Buried in the Osborne Cemetery.

Lockridge, Henry C. (1884-1933). Veteran, Civil War. Buried in the Downs Cemetery.

LOWDEN, Duane Francis. Veteran, World War II.

LOYD, Andrew (1841-*Unknown*). Corporal, Company D, Second Kansas Cavalry, Union Army, Civil War. Wounded in action at Roseville, Arkansas.

LOYD, Warren L. Aviator, U.S. Navy, World War II. **Killed in action.**

LUCE, Israel. Company H, 44th New York Infantry, Union Army, Civil War.

LUCHT, Arthur George (1918-1976). Veteran, World War II. Buried in the Round Mound Immanuel Lutheran Cemetery.

LUCKEY, Joseph Marion (1838-1909). Private, Company C (or G?), Sixth Indiana Infantry, Union Army, Civil War. On his enlistment papers his surname was misspelled as *Lucky*. Buried in the Pleasant Valley Cemetery.

LUDER, Jacob K. (1893-1978). Headquarters Command, 353rd Infantry, World War I. Buried in the Grand Center Cemetery.

LUHMANN, Carl A. (1896-1981). Kansas, Private, Medical Corps, U.S. Army, World War I. Buried in the Round Mound Immanuel Lutheran Cemetery.

LUHMANN, Hugo Otto. Veteran, World War II.

LUHMANN, Raymond P. (1924-1950). Private First Class, U.S. Army and U.S. Army Air Force, World War II. Purple Heart recipient. Buried in the Round Mound Immanuel Lutheran Cemetery.

LUKEN, J. A. Company F, 147th Ohio Infantry, Union Army, Civil War.

LUMAN, Ernest (1895-1971). Veteran, World War I. Buried in the Downs Cemetery.

LUMAN, Howard. Veteran, World War II. **Killed in action.**

LUMAN, James (1834-1882). Private, Missouri Cavalry, Union Army, Civil War. **Prisoner of war** in Andersonville Prison, Georgia, and in Florence, Alabama. Buried in the Union Cemetery.

LUND, Paul Lindon (1917-1995). Private First Class, Battery F, 218th Field Artillery, U.S. Army, World War II. Buried in the Osborne Cemetery.

LUND, Rex Victor (1929-). U.S. Army, Korean War.

LUND, Robert (1835-1907). Union Navy, Civil War. Buried in the Covert Cemetery.

LUND, Robert Lee (1910-1992). U.S. Navy, World War II. Buried in the Osborne Cemetery.

LUND, Roger Dean (1948-). Private First Class, Company E, 123rd Maintenance Battalion, First Armored Division, Fourth Army, U.S. Army, Vietnam War. Recipient of the Air Medal, the Army Commendation Medal, the Bronze Star, Vietnam Cross of Gallantry with Palm, and 2 Bronze Service Stars.

LUNDBLOM, John. Military veteran.

LUNDBLOM, Robert Ray (1920-). Private First Class, Company C, 5th Battalion, U.S. Army, June 3-September 22, 1978.

LUNDY, Robert (1895-). Private, 8th Company, 5th Regiment, 164th Depot Brigade, U.S. Army, World War I.

Lytle, Griffith (1843-1934). Company H, Seventh Pennsylvania Volunteer Infantry, also Companies C and G, 49th Pennsylvania Volunteer Infantry; Union Army, Civil War. Buried in the Downs Cemetery.
