TAYLOR, Clinton Evert "Bob" (1925-1976). U.S. Navy, World War II.

TAYLOR, Harold. Veteran, World War II.

THOMPSON, Arnold LeRoy (1930-1950). Kansas, Private First Class, 384<sup>th</sup> Ordnance Maintenance Company, Korean War. Buried in the Fairview Cemetery.

THORNBURG, Donald Dean (1932- ). Chief Master Sergeant, Air Force Communications Systems, Ballistic & Air to Air Missile Systems, United States Air Force, 1951-1971; Korean and Vietnam Wars. Recipient of the Air Force Outstanding Unit Award, 1 Bronze Service Star, and the Republic of Korea Presidential Citation.

THORNBURG, Floyd A. Private, Battery A, 18<sup>th</sup> Field Artillery Battalion, U.S. Army, World War II.

Thornburg, Keith A. (1941-1983). Veteran, Vietnam War. Buried in the Vincent Cemetery.
